Between 2019 and 2023, the United States experienced notable changes in crime rates across major categories. Below is a comparison of crime rates per 100,000 inhabitants and total occurrences for selected offenses during this period:

Key Observations:

- Violent Crime:** The overall violent crime rate increased by 3.5%. Notably, murder and nonnegligent manslaughter rose by 26.0%, and aggravated assaults increased by 9.7%. Conversely, rape and robbery rates declined by 9.9% and 9.4%, respectively.
- Property Crime:** There was a general decline in property crime rates, with a 7.2% decrease overall. Larceny-theft saw a significant reduction of 12.7%, and burglary decreased by 7.7%. However, motor vehicle thefts experienced a substantial increase of 32.9% during this period.
